



UCy joins NARNIA

The University of Cyprus is taking part in the biggest European research project ever undertaken on the island. The NARNIA project (New Archaeological Research Network for Integrating Approaches to ancient material studies) is an interdisciplinary project, the main objective of which is to provide young researchers with the means to conduct research on ancient Eastern Mediterranean material culture and to develop their analytical skills through a series of research and training activities.

The project has a budget of over 4.5 mln euros and duration of four years. In all, 16 ESR (Doctoral) and three ER (Post Doctoral) fellows will be trained to integrate theory and archaeological sciences for the study of different material categories, including ceramics, metals, glass and mosaics primarily from Cyprus, Greece and Jordan.
